Spirit, or Personality?
ERRON MORNING PRESS:—In your issue of October 10, Mr. Howell gave us a "Is God a Personality?" The vast importance of the theme viewed in any of its varied aspects is my excuse for calling his attention and that of your readers to some points in the article which I am not sure I fully comprehend.

He says "the Bible is the only record of the gods." I had supposed the Rigveda and the Zend Avesta, at least, also records of the gods. Indeed, ancient literature may be said to be a literature of the gods. I would like to ask Mr. Howell if he really believes that the gods were or are really beings. I had supposed they were mere creatures of mortal imaginations excited by superstition. Does he believe the gods have ever manifested themselves to mortals? His article would lead us to believe that he does.

He emphatically denies that the God of the Old Testament is the same God spoken of in the New Testament. I must confess that I have been much perplexed at the vast contrast between the Jehovah revealed in certain portions of the Old Testament and "God the Father" of the New. I have never been able to harmonize the two views, and doubt if any man can do so except on the hypothesis of a progressive revelation. Mr. Howell seems to be something of a Christian when he says "God is spirit," "the true God," and yet he makes or seems to make the startling statement that "every spirit is a spirit, life, from the God the Father," to satiate the lowest condition of being, was once a mortal on this or some other planet!

The New Testament certainly claims that "God, the Father," who Mr. Howell declares is "the true God," was the Creator of all things, and yet Mr. Howell declares: "The Creator of all forms of life is not mentioned in the Bible anywhere." He says "this creative principle" (which surely must be God), "is spirit, which holds all forms together," and yet he repudiates his declaration that Christ taught us "God is spirit." The new version gives us this rendering in the margin as he can read: "I say, and the best scholars I know declare that the article (a) is wanting in the original Greek; so I am not as much 'off' in my exegesis as Mr. Howell would have your readers believe. It seems to me there is a vast "boundless, limitless, illimitable, immense and interminable" difference between saying "God is spirit" and "God is God." No more sublime and far-reaching statement ever was made than this, "God is spirit," but then what becomes of our anthropomorphic conceptions of Deity? and how can we worship spirit as we can have no possible conception of spirit? What I especially want to know is, What does Mr. Howell worship? He says, "Men and women do not know God," which is doubtless true; but does he know God? If so, can he tell us how we may know God?

Mr. Howell asks: "How can we imagine a manifestation of love to mortals I do not know." The Christian claims divine love was manifested in Christ, and that the character of God was revealed in Him, which certainly is very comforting to believe. This worship of God through Christ, and thus through man, is the very truth made so prominent by the apostle John, and it seems to me that so long as we are men we can only worship God through man and in man; can we love God only as we love our fellow men. We can serve God only as we serve men. All attempts of the imagination to conceive of God as a dimly defined great man up above us somewhere are vain. Such attempts are idolatry, it seems to me, in a refined form, but still idolatry.

I must confess I was not able to get much light on my query. What do we worship, from Mr. Howell's article, and I hope he will try again and endeavor to clear up these seeming obscurities and contradictions, and I trust The Morning Press will give him room for it. I cannot conceive how any man can grapple with a more important theme than this we now have before us.
