They Come From, Where They Are Sold and What They Cost. arly everything is sold at second

Are sold and What They Cost. Nearly everything is sold as second hand in New York. It is easy to under-stand why thew is a market for finery, for pianos, for jeweiry and for clothing; for which prices are high and vary a great deal, but shoes are sold at o cheaply when new that thes in shoes at second that there is a very large trade in second hand boots and shoes, mostly shoes, be-cause boots are worn by few at present. The second hand shoe stores win hase-ments in the poorest quarters of the city.

They are generally in the neighbor-hood of second hand clothing stores, but are distinct from them. Sometimes, however, harpains in second hand show stores, but they are old pairs and an as-sortment is soldom supplied. On the east side and in the First ward are many second hand also stores, and in the bend at Sirth Arenno and Carmide street is a second hand aloss stores, and in the sec-start side and loss stores, and in the sec-at Sirth Arenne and Carmine street is quite a coloay.
