Mine Flooded by Accidentally reaking Through the Bottom of a Higher Lift. - Widows and Orphans.

Wilkinaum, Pa. Esb 4.—A terrible mine accident occurred a Janeaville at noon today. Fatrick Boyle and Patrick Cole were working in No. 11 lit. They put their picks through the roof too No. 8 lift. At once there was a great inflow of water. It was impossible to stop the aperture, and the water came in in torrents. The men fied like drowning rats. The roar of the rushing water could be heard all through the mine, and the excitement was terrifying. There were 120 men in the mine at the time. It was a race between the men and the incoming water, Some of the men beat the water to the month of the shaft where they were received. Others who were not so fleet on foot were caught in the water and drowned. Seventeen men perished. Their names are: Patrick McClosky and Pax Kelly, singlet, James Ward.
