DETROIT, Feb. 21.—[Special.]—When the State Medical Society met in Grand Rapids last summer, the then president, in his rettring speech, stated that it had been estimated that the members of the society had saved the lives of 11,000 annually (see his advertisement in the owexpaper reports).
