LANSING, May 12.—An important gathering of the leading officers of the various industrial organizations of this state was held here today at the invitation of General Patrick, the head of the Patrons of Industry.

Edward Hutchins of Allegan county and George W. Caswell of Oakland county were selected as delegates for the P. O. I. to attend the Cincinnati convention May 19, but it has not been learned whether or not the other bodies represented at this conference designated delegates to the Cincinnati convention.

The following address with statement of principles in full, referred to, was agreed upon and will be shortly issued and sent out to all subordinate branches, subdivisions and assemblies.

A conference held in the city of Grand Rapids, Mich., on the 12th inst. had the following organizations represented: Patrons of Industry, Farmers' Alliance and Industrial Union, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Citizens Alliance and Industrial Brotherhood.

The demands of these organizations were carefully compared and their aims and objects were found to be practically identical.
