

WHY THEY STAND

THE PEOPLE ARE WITH THE STRIKING WORKMEN

Grand Demonstration by Organized Labor Yesterday—Address by Senator Doran, James E. McElroy and Fredman Husted

Christie as assistants. The column was headed by Sergeant W. G. of the police force and a platoon of patrolmen, followed by Wurzburg & Gorman, Cabinet Makers, Carpenters and Joiners, Plumbers and Gas Fitters, Painters and Steam Fitters, Electricians, Carriers, Tailors, Shoemakers, Brewers, Wood Carvers, Painters, Smiths, Opera House band, Salesmen, Grocers, Clerks, Butchers, Bricklayers, Bisell factory associates, Furniture Workers Protective association, Gunsmiths, Cabinet Makers, Electricians, and the Teamsters union in wagon filled with drivers and members of the union.
