MUST RENOUNCE THE UNION

Iron Clad Contract Promulgated by the Street Railway Company to Their Employees—Friends of the Laboring Classes Take Notice.

The following is the contract which the Street Railway company requires their employees to sign:

"The undersigned, having entered the employ of the Valley City Street and Cable Railway company of Grand Rapids, a corporation, does, in consideration of such employment, hereby agree to and with said corporation, that during the entire period of said employment, whatever the nature of the same, a day's work shall not be limited to ten hours, but shall consist of so much time each day as the necessities or convenience of the business of said corporation may seem to require, in the judgment of the proper officers, superintendents or foremen thereof; and in case such day's work shall at any time exceed ten hours, I agree to perform the same faithfully and promptly, and for the wages agreed upon, as the case may be, as if I do here by waive any and all benefits which I might otherwise derive from the provisions of Act No. 137 of the Legislature of the state of Michigan of 1885, entitled: 'An act making 10 hours a legal day's work,' approved June 2, 1885, or from any amendments or additions thereto that may hereafter be passed.

"The foregoing and following agreement is understood to be a part of the contract of employment and is subject to no understanding, condition or modification, verbal, parol, or written; and relates to work already performed as well as to work hereafter to be performed, it being expressly agreed and admitted that all prior employment and service were subject to like conditions and stipulations.

"And it is further agreed, That no sum shall be at any time due and payable for my labor until the regular pay day of said corporation, and following the performance of such labor, and no demand for payment shall at any time operate to make any such sum due and payable prior to such pay day, as aforesaid.

"And it is still further agreed, That I will allow and hereby authorize to be taken out of my pay any damages for injury caused by my carelessness to the company's property; or to the property of any one else for which the company may be liable.

"And it is further agreed, That, if any wages or monies due or to become due to me from said company shall be garnished or levied upon in the hands of said company, the latter shall have a lien on such wages or monies, and such as shall thereafter become due for all costs, attorney's fees, expenses, or other charges and disbursements that said company shall in any way be put to, in, about or in connection with such gar-
