SHIPS PULL UP CABLES.

QUEER FISHING WITH PROPELLER SCREWS OF BIG BOATS.

An Ocean Steamship Carries a Piece of Submarine Cable from New York to Liverpool and Back—Experiences of a Ship That Ran into the Mud.

Submarine cables laid in shallow waters are often exposed to greater risks and rougher treatment than the great ocean cables, which sometimes cost their owners a small fortune in repairs.
