

THE MICHIGAN SENATOR INTERVIEWED IN CHICAGO

He Talks of Presidential Timbers, and of the Most ardent supporters of the Republican Party in Michigan.

CHICAGO, June 24.—When James G. Blaine sees fit to take account of stock, let him put down United States Senator Francis B. Stockbridge, of Michigan, as one of the most ardent supporters. This is not, however, tantamount to a declaration that the senator is opposed to the political aspirations of General Alger. He believes, as General Alger himself believes, that party success is the exclusive end of Blaine. Should the plumed knight positively decline to become a candidate, then the senator will give his support to the furtherance of the aspirations of Michigan. "This much and nothing more," Blaine said.

Blaine is the choice of Michigan," he said, and he mentioned the name of the magnetic statesman, a bit of enthusiasm came into his voice. "He is also the choice of the Republican party at large. It only remains for him to state his willingness to accept the nomination and upon the completion of the first ballot in the national convention he will receive it. He may not want it. But I think that he will see that his party wants him and that he will then accept the nomination. He is not a right. But he will not have to do any work. He can remain at Bar Harbor from now until after the election, if he desires without putting a pen to the paper or speaking a word in advocacy of the Republican cause.
