THE STORY OF THE CZAR'S JEALOUSY OF FRANCE.

England Hates to Believe that Russia and the Republic are Fast Friends—The Czar Telescopes his Assumptions.

PARIS, July 29.—The statement to the effect that in spite of the enthusiasm shown in Russia at the visit of the French squadron to Cronstadt, there was an underlying spirit of coldness manifested, is borne out by the entry only by the news received by the London newspapers. But it should here be recalled that these reports have one and all differed through English sources, and therefore they are not to be relied upon to the letter.

The United States and Russia are good friends, and the English newspapers would expect the czar, were he in New York, to sail for New York.
