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TREATED AS CONVICTS.
INNOCENT JEWS ARE SENT OUT OF RUSSIA IN CHAINS.
A Newspaper Correspondent Describes the Humiliating and Cruel Circumstances Attending the Flight of Jewish Exiles—Closely Guarded.
I telegraphed the fact of my having been expelled from Moscow in chains, but as the censorship has become so strict I could not enter into details. I received information that a consular agent at a certain time from the prison (persecution), and accordingly proceeded to stand squarely with both feet on the ground.
