New York, Aug. 27.—Henry Gramlich, aged 21, 235 Buitwiler avenue, Brooklyn, was at the morgue yesterday afternoon, thinking that he might be able to identify the bodies of those who had been employed by Lieber & Mass.

"It was just an even chance that I am not in there now," he said, "for up to a few months ago I worked in the same room with those boys that lie in the coffins there. I did not know, however, I knew that building was going to place some day, and I was afraid to stay."

"I worked for Lieber & Mass as a press feeder up to five months ago and then the building was placed on the ground. I was scared at things that had happened there. About six months ago a heavy weight in the building next to the ruins on the west side fell. It seemed as if the whole thing was going to fall in. We could hear the beams crack and the floor and the walls rocked to such an extent that every man in the printing room ran for his life and got out of the building as soon as possible."

Two weeks after that he had another accident. He said that the floor was on the upper floor there was an enormous weight of paper. The paper lay right next to the front wall of the building, and each case of it weighed about 100 pounds. The floor gave a spasm of pain when the men were carrying a case from the top of the pile and in some ways it fell. The building was shaken to its foundations, and even the people in the basement were terrified by the falling of the floor.
