

HEAD COMMAND

BUT OCCUPIED A VERY HIGH POSITION AMONG GREAT MEN.

Death of William Henry Smith, Government Leader in the English House of Commons--The Harsh Incident in His Career.

LONDON, Oct. 6--Rt. Hon. William Henry Smith, first lord of the treasury, government leader in the house of commons and the oldest of the cabinet, died of pneumonia and heart disease at his home in Grosvenor place, London, at 70.

The news that Mr. Smith's illness had taken a dangerous turn spread quickly, and the tidings of his death shocked his friends. Politicians hurried to the clubs to verify the report and learn more.

The Cabinet, of which Mr. Smith was a member, was crowded until the final announcement came. There was much excitement, and expressions of grief and devotion were heard on every side.

Mr. Smith was only in his 66th year, and he had been for years one of the English public life as considered as being just in their prime.

Mr. Smith was born in 1825 in Grosvenor square, London. His father was the founder of the great publishing house of which he was an eminent member.

Mr. Smith was educated at a private school, and attended the law at Lincoln's Inn.

Mr. Smith was elected to the House of Commons in 1855, when he first met the late Lord Beaconsfield and Mr. Gladstone.
