Mr. Reynolds makes one point only. He says that it is unconstitutional. That is for the Supreme court to decide. The people will not hesitate to approve the land loan against the ipse dixit of even so good a lawyer as Mr. Reynolds.

Mr. Reynolds is entirely mistaken in saying the Supreme court only sustains the legal tender act as a measure. The court has not said that congress can make money under the constitution a full legal tender of paper or metal in peace or war.

The land loan scheme cannot be treated as a bugaboo. It has got to be considered fairly and seriously and something of the kind devised for the relief of business and the people.

It is not an extraordinary affair at all. The government has loaned money to city of Philadelphia for a great exhibition and today Chicago wants to borrow \$5,000,000. Nobody raises the question of constitutionality against the loan to Chicago.

This is admitted on all sides; the volume of money must be enlarged and its enlargement must keep pace from year to year with the increase of population and business. The Republican party acknowledges this and has lately enacted a law by which, through the purchase of silver bullion, it can issue about \$300,000,000 in legal tender treasury notes a year.

But if loans are necessary and it is found that the load of mortgages on the people is even too big for the United States treasury to tackle perhaps loans can be made to cities for water works, gas works, street railways, halls, hospitals, etc. Counties might make loans for court houses and the taxpayers could much easier pay 3 per cent. interest on themselves on loans for desirable public improvements than to pay capitalists 5 per cent. Thus the people would coin their own credit into substantial, grand and needed additions to their comfort and happiness.
