WARDENS AND PENITENTIARY: The decision of the Supreme court of Michigan on the indeterminate plan of sentencing criminals has awakened great deal of discussion.

There is no science in the government prisons. The warden's plan is to have him receive convicts legally sentenced and hold them at hard labor for the time of their imprisonment fixed by the court.

But the fact is three-fourths of all convicts are born criminals or hardened beyond all hope of a complete reform. Immediately upon their discharge they are ready to start on a new career of crime.

With all its dignity and pretensions we do not believe that "penology" embraces a well established reform in prison government beneficial to society or substantially reformatory of the convict.
