WASHINGTON, March 10.—Congressional action on the bill for the improvement of the rivers and harbors is expected to be completed by the end of the month.

The bill, which was introduced by Representative Clegg, provides for the improvement of the Mississippi river and other waterways.

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REPUBLICAN REACTION.

Palmer and McMillan fighting for Control of the Committee.

There is another reason, too. Mayor Palmer has a long record of successful transactions in exchange, based on diplomatic data obtained through his official position.

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BLUSTERING BRITISH

WANT TO GIVE US ANOTHER CEMENT TO WHIP THEM.
