WASHINGTON, March 17.—In regard to reports that the two Democratic nominees between the Democrats and the adherents of the Farmer's Alliance in Kansas, Congressman Simpson said this afternoon that he could not vouch for its accuracy. He said that he had seen the plan formulated and it would not be confined to Kansas alone, but would extend to Nebraska, the two Dakotas, Minnesota and probably Iowa.

Simpson said that he thought the Democrats had the best chance of carrying Kansas by 60,000 majority and they could also carry Nebraska, the two Dakotas and Iowa.

This, he said, would throw the election of president into the house of representatives.
