ROSLYN, Wash. May 11.—Yesterday afternoon a terrible gas explosion occurred in the slope of mine No. 3 of the Northern Pacific Coal company at this point in which the loss of life has exceeded in numbers that of any other disaster that has ever been chronicled in the increase.
