

BEAVER'S SUCCESSOR

John W. Foster Appointed Yesterday.

He Sacrifices a Large Amount of Money for Nine Months of Honor.

WASHINGTON, June 29.—The president today sent to the senate the nomination of John W. Foster of Indiana to be secretary of state to succeed James G. Blaine.

The appointment was expected, as a tip to that effect had been given early this morning. The official adviser of the president says that the appointment will be only until next March even in the event of the president's re-election. Mr. Foster, whose diplomatic connections with other governments are of an exceedingly remarkable character, is unwilling to forego them for a longer time. Moreover, the other governments would be unwilling to hold the office of confidential adviser or counselor for a longer time.
