cared for.

That the board of managers heretofore
is responsible for this improved condition
it would be difficult to prove by the
"old boys" interested. A little light,
however, may be found in the fact that
since all of the ill feeling engendered by
the loss of the actual management of the
Home has been removed, the confidence
of the inmates in and the regard and respect for Major
McKee was not for one moment abated
or endangered, provided, if you please,
that the present management is in the
right place.

Within my knowledge Major McKee
has never had an opportunity to do any
thing here which he did anything like a
just appreciation of the situation and our
interest in the Home. He had just re-
turned from the fact and acted from it
first and last—that this should not be
repeated and that he should not be
responsible for it, but that the inmates
had been treated as though we were
family and friends and not as soldiers.

We know that he believes that all of
the things we need is that of justice,
firmness and love, and that you suppose
we will honor or love him for it. Why
is it that we do not believe that he
thinks he is doing the best thing for us,
