A Meeting Full of Business.

Ended up with a Heap of Fun in the Evening at Ottawa Beach.

The second day's meeting of the State Pharmaceutical association was called to order at Elk's hall yesterday morning by President Coleman.

First-That the year for the association be defined, so that in paying dues a regular time could be fixed upon and understood.

Second-That members two years in arrears should be dropped from the rolls and not be readmitted except on the payment of all past dues.

Third-That a certificate of membership be issued to each member, and be read and signed by the secretary, and that certificate should be next in design and suitable for framing.

Fourth-That it be proper to make an effort to send delegates to general conventions of druggists to other cities, and the connection with sister organizations of other states might be strengthened.

The report and recommendations were submitted to Messrs. Parker, Brown and Johnson, who were appointed by the president.

Chairman Verner, of the committee on legislation submitted a report recommending that a strong remonstrance be made against any motion to change or modify existing pharmacy laws; that an amendment be proposed which the employer equally responsible with the employer when the latter is not officially registered; that the State Pharmacists should have power to employ legal assistance; and that action without the consent of the county board be allowed for the removal of the former committee on legislation.

On the adoption of the report, Chairman Fairchild of the committee on membership read his report which was approved by the association.

John Peck of the committee on trade interests recommended first, that the buying and selling of proprietary medicine should be discontinued, and discouraged, and that druggists refer to deal in these medicines. After a good deal of discussion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved-That the sale of proprietary medicines that are handled by the druggist, and are advertised, and that druggists endeavor to sell in their places medicines of similar properties to those advertised, be discontinued.

Second-That to entice and other compounds made by druggists to sell, be discontinued.

That the sale of liquor laws be strictly observed and their violation be neither palliated or excused. Adopted.

That a committee be appointed to select a store and report. Messrs. Verner, Bassett and Johnson were appointed on this committee.

Fifth-That when one druggist furnishes a competitor with information, profits should be equally divided.

It was suggested that containers of uniform size and shape be used, and that manufacturers be asked to give their assent. Before the adjournment was concluded the convention adjourned until 2 o'clock.

On Monday morning July 25, at 12 o'clock a convention was called to order by the secretary after which a letter was read from St. Louis, Mo. The association had been appointed by the president to attend the meeting but as no Illinois delegates had appeared as the hall their whereabouts is shrouded in mystery. Letters were also read from druggists who complained of the work that the association was doing.
