"The first instance wherein I have been able to give any benefit derived from the prohibition clause in divorce cases came yesterday morning," reported Judge Aldrich to a Morning Star reporter. "Some time ago I received that in all cases where the proof would warrant, to prohibit the marriage of the defendant for a period of two years and six months."
