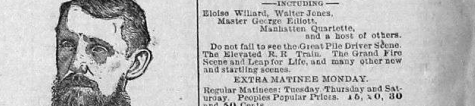

CHOLERA PRECAUTIONS. The local Board of Health Appeals to Citizens. In anticipation of a possible visitation of cholera, the board of health has issued a circular calling attention to the following section of the city charter...

Sec. 18. (As added April 25, 1874, and amended September 4, 1883.) It shall be the duty of the board of health to block or tenement house in the city of Grand Rapids, where the use thereof for any purpose other than the usual accumulation of offal, stops, kitchen or other refuse, to such an extent as to constitute a nuisance, with light covers, which they shall deposit there, and such covers shall be so constructed as to remove such offal, stops, kitchen or other refuse, from the building to such receptacles as shall be designated by the board of health, or remove the same beyond the limits of the city twice in each week, to wit, on the first and third day of November, and once each week from the first day of November to the first day of May each year, and promptly cleanse such box or receptacle.

Sec. 2. Whenever in the opinion of the board of health a nuisance exists, or is about to exist, to the public health, or a nuisance, said common council shall cause a notice to be served by any police constable of said city or by any duly appointed inspector of the board of health, upon the owner, agent or occupant of said lot or lots, or premises, to comply with the provisions of this section, by posting the same up in conspicuous place upon said premises.

MORTUARY STATISTICS. Matters of Interest From the Board of Health Report. The board of health's mortuary reports for August shows that 124 deaths occurred in the city during the month, the fifth ward leading with a total of 17. The report also shows the number of deaths to be 131, in which the fifth ward leads with the greatest number of deaths, which was caused from cholera infantum with a total of 10, being five more than were caused by consumption.
