

WANTS IT SEPARATION HOT

Field Marshal Halstead Reviews the Result.

He Gives Various Good Reasons for the Faith That Was in Him.

New York, Nov. 13.—I respond to an invitation to explain the discrepancies between his campaign predictions and the result of the election.

Allow me to recall some of the reflections that I attributed to reasoning. Harrison's administration seemed to me to be the most prudent and the most successful, the country appeared prosperous.

The notification speeches of the Democratic candidates, that were truly described as synonymous with the ruder political contented first agreement for the reconstruction did me no good.

The affirmative action of the Democratic convention recommending the establishment of state banks of issue should have started the business men at the money centers but they had avoided in Cleveland because he had opposed free coinage in silver and refused to hear evidence against him.
