The Rebellion in British India A Remarkable Leader.

The Bombay correspondent of the New York Herald, of the date of January 10, says that at present there are at least two hundred thousand of the Sepoy rebels in the field against the British government. The mutiny is very far from being subdued. Retreating to their almost inaccessible fortresses and jungles, the Sepoy rebels are constantly killing out in the provinces. The great rebel leader, Nana Sahib, and his lieutenant, are yet large to encourage the spirit of disaffection and mutiny, and until they are taken and hanged, there can be no peace or security in British India. Of one of Nana's lieutenants the Herald's correspondent thus speaks:

Exactly the most singular character that has been brought forth by the Indian mutiny, is Tantia Topes. About the time of the fall of Bikaner, Tantia seemed to have made his headquarters at least at this time he first began to be formidable. Suddenly appearing at the head of the twenty-five thousand troops, he has now for nearly a year kept the English forces in unceasing motion. Brigades after brigades, battalions after battalions, and regiments after regiments have been sent out to meet the columns in pursuit outnumber him by tens of thousands, and his army has dwindled from more than three hundred to a mere handful. He has been met and defeated again and again, but he has never been completely routed. He has been a week's pass, but that some new accident has happened out of a fight with Tantia; he has always the way for escape, and the next day comes down on some unexpected village, slaying his troops and away he flies like a meteor. He is so quick and deft, and so quick through the fingers of his pursuers. At least a dozen times he has been completely routed, but at last Tantia was surrounded, no longer left, &c. The next day would find him out-leading his pursuers some sixty or seventy miles. It is not exaggerating to say, or seventy miles is no uncommon march for this Mahatma. He is the King of the Mountains. He remains more or more of a Hindoo hero, King Philip, than any other, and he has appeared upon the stage since the days of Scylla and Lemnos. Some of our men have captured a subject, would find a grand one in him—let me tell you, you no one knows him, no one can give the least clue as to his connections—he is wholly unknown in my country, and by some means a mythical representative of Nana himself. How he has managed to escape the numerous large bodies of British troops, he has lost all but about one thousand men, and yet keeps at least forty thousand English troops at the top of their toes every day for days to week, month to month, and I might almost add, year to year.

Prof. Morse and His Telegraph.
From the Scientific American.
Through a correspondent at Washington we learn that Prof. Morse has recently gone to some of the West India Islands, for the purpose of constructing a new telegraph line, and improving the old improvements. The government of Porto Rico has ordered him a passport and escort, by which he can traverse the entire island, and thereby determine the best routes and stations. It is also thought that he will make some connection by sea-cables with Cuba, so that soon all these islands will be in communication with the continent. True, our commercial and marine interest will be greatly benefited.

A Nice Little Lot of Gold.—The Bank of England letters for the week ending March 9, state that the stock of gold now in the vaults amounts to \$19,551,022 sterling, while the notes in circulation are \$20,438,010; so that if every note were to be presented for payment, the bank could easily redeem them all. Two years ago, the gold in the bank amounted but \$14,000,000.

Mr. Hartung's Case.—The New York Assembly has contended itself with passing a resolution requesting Gov. Morgan, to commute the sentence of Mrs. Hartung. At first thought to be a case of "mistaken identity," but by legislation which was clearly unconstitutional.
