COMMON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

REGULAR MEETING, Thursday Evening, May 6th, 1859. Court met pursuant to adjournment. Present—The Mayor, and Aldermen A. M., Avery, Clancy, Davis, Hyde, Ives, Luce, and Williamson.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. The following accounts were presented, to-wit: McGeown, grading on Pearl street, \$55.63; H. H. Downs, service, clerk election, 3.00; H. Gezon, burying dead animals, 50.00; G. Evans, services, 160.85; N. McLeintin, labor, 3d highway dist., 7.87; B. Turk, lumber, 14.23.

On motion, council proceeded to appoint by ballot, two commissioners of the city Cemetery, one for one year, and one for two years, with the following result: For 1 year, W. P. Mills; J. W. Pierce, 1. Second ballot, F. B. Gilbert, 3.

On motion of Ald. Williamson, F. B. Gilbert was declared appointed commissioner for 3 years.

On motion of W. P. Mills, W. P. Mills was declared appointed the commissioner for one year.

The petition of O. Pearl and 5 others, relative to the paving of Canal street, was presented, and referred to the committee on streets.

The petition of H. Dean, asking to be re-appointed city Sexton, was presented, and on motion he was duly appointed to said office.

Ayes 9, nays 0.

The committee on accounts, reported back the following recommending their allowance, which were allowed, ordered paid, and the clerk instructed to draw his orders for the amounts, viz: E. McElvay, grading on Pearl street, \$55.63; H. H. Downs, services, clerk election, 3.00; H. Gezon, burying dead animals, 50.00.

Ayes 9, nays 0.

The estimate of H. Yates, city surveyor, of the grading of Division street, from Monroe street south to the city limits, was presented, and on motion of Ald. Avery, the same was referred to the committee on streets.

On motion of Ald. Almy, the Mayor was requested to appoint a committee of three, whose duty it shall be to compile and arrange the city ordinances, and that the city attorney be appointed one of the members of said committee.

The Mayor appointed as such committee, Ald. Luce, Almy, and J. W. Champlin.

The petition of W. A. Berkey, asking permission to use a portion of Canal street, in front of Sweet's mill, for the purpose of framing a building, was presented, and on motion of Ald. Avery, was accepted, and the use of twenty feet of ground granted to him, at the place and for the purpose specified.

The account of the Grand Rapids Gas Light Company, was presented, and referred to the committee on claims and accounts.

Whereas, it appears from the report of the committee on streets, that the highway leading from the Plainfield road, so-called—near the Depot of the Detroit & Milwaukee Railway Co., east by the residence of Aaron Kunkle, has been used as public highway for six or seven years, and that the boundaries of the said highway, from the north and south quarter lines in Section Eighteen west, to the Plainfield road, are not sufficiently defined; Therefore, resolved, That the common council of the city of Grand Rapids do hereby determine, and establish the said highway upon and within the following described boundaries, to-wit: The centre line of said highway shall commence at a point three hundred and thirteen and one half feet north from the Section line (18) in Section Eighteen (18) and Nineteen (19) in the city of Grand Rapids, on the north and south quarter lines in Section Eighteen, thence running west parallel to said Section line, to the Plainfield road, so called. The said highway to be 60 feet in width.

On motion of Ald. Avery, the same was referred to the committee on streets.

On motion of Ald. Luce, the committee appointed to compile and arrange the ordinances were instructed to draft and report an ordinance for the government of the Fire Department.

On motion, council adjourned. E. M. DOUBLEDAY, City Clerk.
